

Today the Grandparents Raising Grandchildren Trust New Zealand has over 5,200 members and operates throughout New Zealand providing information, support, advice and advocacy for grandparents raising their grandchildren/kin on a full-time basis. Membership is diverse across European, Maori and Pasifika, age ranges from early 40s to 91 and includes great grandparents raising great grandchildren

The mission of the Trust is to provide support services that promote and preserve the wellbeing of families/whanau, help to reduce stress and maximise stability in the lives of grandchildren/kin children and grandparent/kincarers in circumstances where the children are not being raised by their parents.

Uawa - Tolaga Bay

Incredible fund-raising and effort for the wharf reconstruction: "The community of only 800 people have raised in excess of \$5 million over 20 years towards the cost of the \$ 5.5 million wharf restoration project." The project was completed in June 2012.

Hawea Community



Hawea is a small community of approximately 3,000 people in the lakes area of Central Otago. The area has excelled over the past two years in responding to a growing population, with a need for improved facilities and services. In doing so, Hawea has maintained a strong community spirit and worked tirelessly to preserve the unique beauty of the area.

The Hawea community has a huge volunteer input from various members of the community whom are proud of the region and are prepared to spearhead the work and provide leadership for a wide range of community initiatives and activities. These volunteer initiatives include

- Raised \$1.5m to extend the community centre
- Established and operated green waste
- . Undertook development of foreshore reserve
- · Raised \$13,000 for cancer sufferer
- Established and run village newspaper
